Here is another good news story! Barb Willis and Barb Divjak said that during Covid, our Tidewater chapter felt the need to increase our food drive efforts for the Southeastern Food Banks. Our team held food collection drives behind our meeting place on Virginia Beach Blvd for the holiday time periods where the needs are the greatest. For three years, 2019-2021, during the quarantine periods, we collected trunk loads of food 3 times a year. We collected food for over 6500 meals. In 2022, as our meeting began to resume, we began collecting cash donations for food drives for Easter, Thanksgiving and Christmas time periods. Our wonderful retirees

have donated over \$8,800 in last 3 years through 2025.

These cash donations provided over 17,600 meals for our area. We have the best retirees and their generosity is amazing for organizing and continuing their support for our annual food drives. The Tidewater chapter of NEREA would like to thank the entire team for their efforts and time in collecting and donating all this food and money to help others who are in need!

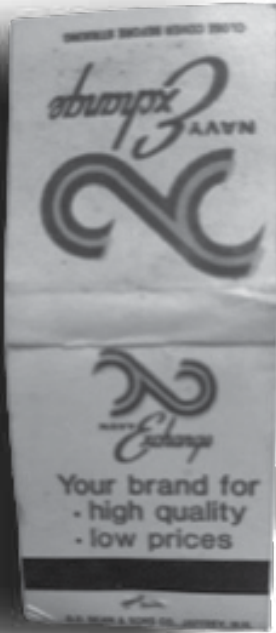


# DID YOU KNOW

- 1958 The conversion of Ship's Stores Ashore to Exchanges began in October with NS Bermuda. Additionally, approval to begin converting Navy Exchange Grocery Sections to Commissary Stores was also approved.
- 1969 A new concept in providing service to the Sailor and the Sailor's Family was put into effect on the 26th of February with the official opening of the Navy Exchange Service Center at the San Diego Naval Station.
- 1977 All NRSO operated enlisted clubs were transferred to BuPers on the 1st of October. The CNO had formally declared that management responsibility for all clubs and messes within the Navy would be exercised by BuPers.
- 1979 Navy Seabees worked over 8,400 man days constructing a 22 guest unit lodge at NS Rota Spain, which at the time provided sleeping and eating facilities for families of up to four at a unit cost of \$25 a day.
- 1980 A Baskin Robbins Ice Cream Shop opened in January at Navy Exchange Naples Italy.
- 1981 NAVRESSO set up a toll-free customer comment/complaint line as part of its "VIP Program." Calls were received 24 hours a day and specialists at the call center responded to every call.
- 1987 The Flight Line Inn, a fast food cafeteria serving a limited menu that featured hamburgers, chicken and specialty sandwiches opened at NAS Willow Grove.
- 1992 Navy Exchanges at 136 locations worldwide generated \$1.96 billion in sales, with profits of \$76.6 million.
- 1996 Sales for the month of December at NEX Naples Wendy's topped \$197,000 for the first time in the store's history. At 6:00 PM, one hour before closing on the last business day, the Wendy's reached \$7656 for the day — \$53 over what was needed to break the record.
- 2002 A ground breaking ceremony was held in November for a new Navy Lodge on Ford Island, Hawaii. This new lodge would offer 150 suites and rooms. Amenities would include a swimming pool, and a children's playground. Rooms would be equipped with cable TV, video cassette player, direct-dial telephone service and a kitchenette complete with microwave.
- 2010 NEX Pearl Harbor held a parking lot tire sales event named "Install at the Mall". The event generated sales of \$50,600, which translated to the sale of 394 tires and 352 Tire Service Agreements.
- 2011 NEREA's 17th annual conventions was held 15-19 May in Virginia Beach, VA
- 2017 NEX Annapolis, MD opened a William III Cafe at the U.S. Naval Academy's Nimitz Library. The cafe offered a variety of coffee and espresso drinks, bakery items, custom salads and breakfast and lunch sandwiches.
- 2020 NEREA's Scholarship Fund awarded six \$2,000 scholarships, and one \$1000 scholarship for academic year 2020-2021.
- 2022 The first-of-it's kind "Provisions Market" opened at NEX Oceana on the 26th on February to test new technology for food and beverage transactions.
- 2024 The first UPS Store opened inside a Navy Exchange at NAS Pensacola Aviation Plaza.
- 2025 The 100th NEX Micro Market opened at Naval Submarine Base Kings Bay on the 5th of August. A Micro Market is a self-service, self-checkout NEX store (average size of 500 square feet) offering a broad assortment of fresh salad and sandwiches, fresh fruit, parfaits, chips, candy, cookies, microwaveable and ready to eat meals, cold beverages, coffee, and an assortment of personal items. A hybrid of a vending and a convenience store. (See two pictures on Memories Page)
- 2026 Fourteen (14) NEX automotive service centers have been, or are being re-branded under the Pep Boys name. Four of the automotive service centers were converted in 2025, the remaining locations will be implemented on a rolling basis through 2026. Look for this re-branding at NEX's in CA, VA, FL, WA, HI and MS.

# WHAT DO YOU DO WITH ALL YOUR TIME?

*It is often asked of retired people from non-retiree's "What do you do with all your time"? Well I think it is important to show you what some of Nexcom's retirees are doing.*



My mother was diagnosed with Alzheimer's disease in 2012. The diagnosis was devastating, and her physician offered little guidance on next steps. I turned to the Alzheimer's Association, where I found compassion, support groups, and educational seminars at their Norfolk office—marking the beginning of our family's journey with this disease.

In 2013, I began fundraising for the Alzheimer's Association in honor of my mom by hosting a golf outing with our longtime golf group. That first event raised \$680 from 28 friends who all knew and cared about her. This year marks the 14th annual ENDALZ Charity Golf Tournament on June 6 at Red Wing Golf Course in Virginia Beach. Since 2013, the event has raised \$87,392 for the Alzheimer's Association. Each year we welcome



approximately 120 golfers and 25 volunteers. The event includes golf, lunch, raffles, and a silent auction. Participants are encouraged to wear purple in honor of those living with or lost to Alzheimer's or another dementia. We also raise additional funds through raffles on social media throughout the year.

More than 7 million Americans are living with Alzheimer's or another dementia, and families bear 70% of the lifetime cost of care. The disease claims more lives than breast and prostate cancer combined, and one in three older adults dies with Alzheimer's or another dementia. By 2050, more than 13 million Americans are expected to be affected, with care costs potentially exceeding \$1 trillion—posing a serious healthcare and economic challenge.

Watching my mother suffer through this devastating disease has changed me forever. That is why I will always stand with the Alzheimer's Association in the fight for a cure, and why I believe so deeply in a future where no family must endure this heartbreak. Thank You for the opportunity to tell my event story.
